Waters Wye Associates report: The Cumulative Impact of Climate Change Policies on UK Energy Intensive Industries - Are policies Effectively Focused? - 27th July 2010

This report shows that the cumulative impact of all climate change policies is significant, especially on energy intensive sectors (see Graph 1). It also illustrates that if the government continues to simply add one energy or carbon reduction levy after another on to the energy intensive sectors then the risk is that these industries will no longer be able to compete internationally and will simply cease to operate in the UK. Facing this burden in the UK, some sectors are already proving unable to reinvest in their infrastructure due to the increased energy tax burden in the UK and will consequently "wither on the vine" through an inability to produce cutting edge products or compete with foreign producers. In either scenario, "carbon leakage" will result: the loss of investment, jobs and carbon emissions to competitors, some may have fewer controls on CO₂ emissions or regimes that better protect energy intensive sectors from these tax burdens.

Oil and gas companies base their strategies around investing in fuel reserves, production and refining facilities for the future. Emitting carbon dioxide (CO₂) will become more and more expensive in the future, as regulation of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions is progressively tightened up. That means the decisions that these companies - and their investors - take now will lock them into potentially expensive future carbon liabilities for decades. Yet oil and gas companies are not disclosing to investors the potentially huge costs they will have to pay in order to continue emitting massive amounts of CO₂ and other GHGs in the



future.
